As many of you may be aware, after their high school years, young people have a high dropout rate from church. They are well connected with other students during their youth years but often don't feel connected with the overall adult-based church and drift away during the college years. An added blessing with our present youth being so involved with our adult services is that they are already connecting with the church as a whole. They are not just meeting separately in the Youth Center, but they are actively serving and participating in our whole church worship! Our youth are not the future of the church... they are vital members and gifted ministers in the church right now!

As we continue to sort through how God has sovereignly worked through these last two pandemic years, let us rejoice in the ways in which He has grown us, stretched us, and blessed us ... especially for the ongoing ministry of our amazing Teen Tech Team!
