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1 Thessalonians 2:17-20

¹⁷ But we, brothers *and sisters*, having been orphaned from you *by absence* for a short while—in person, not in spirit—were all the more eager with great desire to see your face. ¹⁸ For we wanted to come to you—I, Paul, more than once—and Satan hindered us. ¹⁹ For who *is* our hope, or joy or crown of pride, in the presence of our Lord Jesus at His coming? Or *is it* not indeed you? ²⁰ For you are our glory and joy.

Order of operating for training ourselves to understand God's Word:

- 1. What does God say about Himself.
- 2. What does God say about His will and work.
- 3. What does God say about us.
- 4. What does God say to us.
- 5. What does God say for us.

Jeremiah 29:11

¹¹ For I know the plans that I have for you,' declares the LORD, 'plans for prosperity and not for disaster, to give you a future and a hope.

Jeremiah 28:15-17

¹⁵ Then Jeremiah the prophet said to Hananiah the prophet, "Listen now, Hananiah: the LORD has not sent you, and you have made this people trust in a lie. ¹⁶ Therefore, this is what the LORD says: 'Behold, I am going to remove you from the face of the earth. This year you are going to die, because you spoke falsely against the LORD.'" ¹⁷ So Hananiah the prophet died in the same year, in the seventh month.

A. The **bond** of our fellowship is **deep spiritual affection**.

1 Peter 5:1-3

¹Therefore, I urge elders among you, as *your* fellow elder and a witness of the sufferings of Christ, *and* one who is also a fellow partaker of the glory that is to be revealed: ² shepherd the flock of God among you, exercising oversight, not under compulsion but voluntarily, according to *the will of* God; and not with greed but with eagerness; ³ nor yet as domineering over those assigned to your care, but by proving to be examples to the flock.

1 Thessalonians 3:6

⁶ But now that Timothy has come to us from you, and has brought us good news of your faith and love, and that you always think kindly of us, longing to see us just as we also *long to see* you,

Hebrews 10:23-25

²³Let's hold firmly to the confession of our hope without wavering, for He who promised is faithful; ²⁴ and let's consider how to encourage one another in love and good deeds, ²⁵ not abandoning our own meeting together, as is the habit of some people, but encouraging one another; and all the more as you see the day drawing near.

- 1. That stimulates our Christian lifestyle.
- 2. That strengthens our Christian resolve.

1 Thessalonians 2:18

- ¹⁸ For we wanted to come to you—I, Paul, more than once—and Satan hindered us.
 - **B.** The **threat** to our fellowship is **Satanic affliction**.

1 Peter 5:8-10

⁸ Be of sober *spirit*, be on the alert. Your adversary, the devil, prowls around like a roaring lion, seeking someone to devour. ⁹ So resist him, firm in *your* faith, knowing that the same experiences of suffering are being accomplished by your brothers and sisters who are in the world. ¹⁰ After you have suffered for a little while, the God of all grace, who called you to His eternal glory in Christ, will Himself perfect, confirm, strengthen, *and* establish *you*.

Isaiah 14:12-15

12 How you have fallen from heaven,
You star of the morning, son of the dawn!
You have been cut down to the earth,
You who defeated the nations!
13 But you said in your heart,
'I will ascend to heaven;
I will raise my throne above the stars of God,
And I will sit on the mount of assembly
In the recesses of the north.
14 I will ascend above the heights of the clouds;
I will make myself like the Most High.'
15 Nevertheless you will be brought down to Sheol,
To the recesses of the pit.

The **hindrances** of Satan are **momentary**. They cannot **prevent**:

1. The advancement of the gospel.

Philippians 1:12-14

12 Now I want you to know, brothers *and sisters*, that my circumstances have turned out for the greater progress of the gospel, ¹³ so that my imprisonment in *the cause of* Christ has become well known throughout the praetorian guard and to everyone else, ¹⁴ and that most of the brothers *and sisters*, trusting in the Lord because of my imprisonment, have far more courage to speak the word of God without fear.

2. The **enhancement** of our **faith**.

2 Corinthians 12:7-10

⁷ Because of the extraordinary *greatness* of the revelations, for this reason, to keep me from exalting myself, there was given to me a thorn in the flesh, a messenger of Satan to torment me—to keep me from exalting myself! ⁸ Concerning this I pleaded with the Lord three times that it might leave me. ⁹ And He has said to me, "My grace is sufficient for you, for power is perfected in weakness." Most gladly, therefore, I will rather boast about my weaknesses, so that the power of Christ may dwell in me. ¹⁰ Therefore I delight in weaknesses, in insults, in distresses, in persecutions, in difficulties, in behalf of Christ; for when I am weak, then I am strong.

C. The **future** of our fellowship our **Savior's appearing**.

1 Thessalonians 2:19

- ¹⁹ For who is our hope, or joy or crown of pride, in the presence of our Lord Jesus at His coming? Or is it not indeed you?
 - 1. Our great consolation will be our eternal rest with Jesus.
 - 2. Our **great celebration** will be the **eternal fellowship** of the church.

Daniel 12:1-3

¹ "Now at that time Michael, the great prince who stands *guard* over the sons of your people, will arise. And there will be a time of distress such as never occurred since there was a nation until that time; and at that time your people, everyone who is found written in the book, will be rescued. ² And many of those who sleep in the dust of the ground will awake, these to everlasting life, but the others to disgrace *and* everlasting contempt. ³ And those who have insight will shine like the glow of the expanse of heaven, and those who lead the many to righteousness, like the stars forever and ever.
